REGULATIONS

- 1. The Floral Art competitions are open to all.
- 2. Entries must be on the official Entry Form and sent to the Floral Art Co-ordinator: Mr. Brian White, 6 Coulter Close, Dumfries, DG1 3JL

Entry is FREE - Photocopies of the Entry Form are acceptable. Please also enclose a stamped addressed envelope for acknowledgement of entries.

Floral Art entries will be accepted from 1st July & no later than 31st July' 23

- 3. All exhibits must be the unaided work of the competitor and must be assembled in the hall, unless otherwise stated.
- 4. Staging measurements are approximate.
- 5. Entries may be staged from 2.00pm on Friday 18th August until 2.00am on Saturday 19th August 2023.
- 6. Competitors should be prepared to maintain their exhibits, if necessary, whilst the show is open without undue hindrance to the viewing public.
- 7. At 5.00pm on Sunday 20th August everyone will vacate the hall leaving the exhibits intact. When the hall is empty only competitors will be readmitted on production of the appropriate removal ticket which should be always worn.

 All exhibits must be removed by 6.00pm.
- 8. During staging, all competitors are requested to ensure that the floor is always kept clean and dry. Spray paints and glue guns may not be used in the hall.
- 9. All competitor's property will be at the risk of the competitor and neither Ayr & District Flower Show, SAFAS, nor the owners or occupiers of the premises in which the competitions are held can accept any liability whatsoever for any loss or damage sustained by any competitor.
- 10. The judge's decision is final.
- 11. Photographs of entries must not be posted on Social Media sites until after the judging has taken place.
- 12. Empty spaces detract from the overall appearance of the Show so, if for any reason, competitors are unable to stage their exhibits they should notify the Floral Art Co-ordinator prior to the staging: -

The Flower Arranging Classes will be staged and judged in accordance with the NAFAS Competitions Manual Third Edition 2015 ~ copies of the Manual can be obtained via the NAFAS website www.nafas.org.uk.

Some helpful notes for competitors: -

An exhibit is composed of natural plant material in all its forms with or without accessories contained within the space specified by the show schedule.

Unless otherwise stated:-

- Exhibits will be staged on continuous tabling 76cm from the floor.
 The tabling and background will be covered in cream fabric.
 Nothing must be attached to the background.
- · Natural plant material should predominate.
- Exhibits should not exceed allocated space.
- The inclusion of artificial plant material is not permitted.
- Bases, drapes, backgrounds and title cards are not considered accessories.
- Additionally coloured natural plant material is permitted.

SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

Class 1. MORNING HAS BROKEN. Novice Class. An exhibit.

Space allowed: width 75cm, depth 65cm, height 110cm.

Open to those new to flower arranging.

Class 2. TOMORROWS WORLD. Novice Class. An exhibit.

Space allowed: width 75cm, depth 65cm, height 110cm. Open to competitors who have not won a prize in flower arranging at the Ayr & District Flower Show.

Class 3. BOX CLEVER. An exhibit to include a box or boxes.

Space allowed: width 90cm, depth 65cm, height 110cm.

Class 4. **FABULOUS FOLIAGE.** A large scale exhibit featuring fresh foliage.

To be staged at floor level on a circular base painted grey. Background cream fabric. Viewed and judged from the front.

Space allowed: diameter 105cm, height 180cm.

Class 5. LISTEN TO THE OCEAN. An exhibit inspired by the sea.

Space allowed: width 90cm, depth 65cm, height 110cm

Class 6. **RUSH HOUR.** An exhibit influenced by modern living. Space allowed: width 75cm, depth 65cm, height 110cm

Class 7. **STICKS AND STONES.** An exhibit in which plant material need not predominate but must play an important part. To be staged on continuous tabling raised 76cm from the floor without a background.

Viewed and judged from both sides.

Space allowed: width 120cm, depth 65cm, height 40cm. Note height restriction.

Class 8. **HEADLINE NEWS.** An exhibit to depict a news item, real or imaginary. Title to be included.

Space allowed: width 90cm, depth 65cm, height 110cm.

Class 9. **TA-DAH!** An exhibit emphasising the use of vibrant colour. Space allowed: width 90cm, depth 65cm, height 110cm.

Class 10. **DYNAMIC DUO.** An exhibit featuring two blooms.

Foliage and/or other components optional.

Space allowed: width 75cm, depth 65cm, height 110cm.

Class 11. MOONSHADOW. A small scale exhibit.

Space allowed: width 17cm, depth 17cm, height 25cm.

Can be brought in partially assembled.

Class 12. THE RHYTHM OF THE NIGHT. An exhibit.

Space allowed: width 90cm, depth, 65cm, height 110cm.
